Your report against Douglas J Bartholomew has been assessed by the Licensed Mental Health Program.

Chapter 18.130 RCW, Regulation of Health Professions - Uniform Disciplinary Act, explains the complaint and disciplinary process and defines conduct, acts and conditions that constitute unprofessional conduct. The Secretary of Health has the authority to take disciplinary action against a practitioner's license for unprofessional conduct. The Secretary of Health does not have the authority under the statute (jurisdiction) to resolve issues outside the listed violations.

After careful consideration of the information you sent, the Licensed Mental Health Program determined not to pursue disciplinary action against Mr. Bartholomew's license to practice as a Mental Health Counselor. The closure of a complaint in no way indicates that the complaint filed was without merit.

The report was not pursued because no violation was determined.

The Licensed Mental Health Program has limited investigative and financial resources for the pursuit of complaints against health care providers. The Licensed Mental Health Program may reconsider a complaint that has been closed only if additional relevant information is received.

Content of complaint:

On Friday, November 21, 2003, I completed the intake forms for DV counseling with the office of Doug Bartholomew, and I scheduled the first three appointments for the intake interviews on December 2, 3 and 4. Later that evening of November 21, 2003, at approximately 6:30 PM (noting recent phone records) Mr. Bartholomew phoned me and stated that I would not be accepted into his DV program unless I was willing to accept a court term of 18 months or more. I then informed Mr. Bartholomew that "the court has jurisdiction over me for 12 months." At that time Mr. Bartholomew stated that "[he] would not accept me in [his] program because [his] program requires a minimum of 18 months before [he] will accept a client." At that time, following my revocation of any release of information that I had signed along with the intake forms, we ended the conversation.

On or about December 2, 2003, Mr. Bartholomew phoned me again and asked "[am I] ready to join the 'big boys' and accept an [Stipulated Order of Continuance] (SOC) for a term of 18 months or more?" I again informed Mr. Bartholomew that my SOC is for 12 months, and I will not agree to any modification that extends beyond 12 months.

On January 9, 2004, Mr. Bartholomew responded to a request for information from my probation officer, Michelle Thomas. Ms. Thomas did have my consent and authorization to make such request. However, in Mr. Bartholomew's reply to Ms. Thomas's he states that I "rejected [his program]." This statement is a blatant lie and I have requested that Mr. Bartholomew correct this misrepresentation. As I explained to Mr. Bartholomew, I am more than willing to enroll in his program, but as for a matter of my legal obligation I will not agree to extend the time of which the court has jurisdiction over me.

My refusal to agree to an extension of time in which the court has jurisdiction over me is not "a rejection of a counseling program." I have no obligation, legal or otherwise to extend the time to which I am to subordinate to the court. I have asked that Mr. Bartholomew correct his statement that I "rejected [his program]" as that is not the clinically or legally accurate.

I find this misrepresentation slanderous, defamatory, and such a misrepresentation could be prejudice me, i.e. cause me harm, if such misrepresentation is not corrected. It is an untruth, and I have a reasonable expectation that Mr. Bartholomew be complete, accurate and truthful when he makes any disclosures about his and my interactions.

I request that the Washington State Department of Health contact Mr. Bartholomew and require him to correct his misrepresentations and accurately explain to the my probation officer, that I reject an extension of time in which the court has jurisdiction over me, and

at no time did I reject Mr. Bartholomew's DV program, so long as it is understood that I am finished in 12 months.


I received an information release from you regarding [redacted] I need to clarify that he is not and has never been a client at this agency. No money ever passed hands and I have never seen him in a therapy or intake session. I'm actually not sure I've ever actually physically seen him. He didn't get through the process of completing the forms.

Consequently I'm not sure what the issues of confidentiality are since he is not and has never been a client.

He is welcome to start the intake/assessment process to become a client here at such a time as he provides me with a court order or stipulation which allows enough time for him to attend the program in a manner consistent with RCW 26.50.150. Specifically, that law clearly states that no program shall be for a fixed length of time or number of sessions, that it has to be long enough that a client can be kept in a program until they earn their way out, not just complete a fixed length of time. Obviously anyone would realize that a stipulation which is shorter than the time it would take to complete the intake/assessment and the minimum length of the program and it's components is worthless because you can't get thirteen months into twelve months in the first place, much less have enough time to require the client to earn their way out before being closed.

has stated a number of times that he wants me to document that this program has "rejected" him. That is simply untrue. He has not met the reasonable minimum requirements for getting started. This is not a matter of him being rejected. The onus is upon him to qualify, not upon us to conform to his demands. *He has rejected us. We have not rejected him.*

Dear Mr. Bartholomew,

I am in receipt of your letter to Ms. Thomas, dated January 9, 2004, and I object to a statement in the first paragraph wherein you state, "I didn't get through the process of completing the forms."

On November 21, 2003, I sat in your office with Heather, and my fiancé for over 45 minutes filling out all forms that were presented to me.

Furthermore, your comment in a previous writing that the release for the "victim" was "incorrectly" filled in is confusing to me. I have two copies of the release. One containing handwritten restrictions that I believe reasonable, second release signed with no restrictions, handwritten or otherwise.

I ask to be informed exactly what forms were not filled out, and where those forms to have been provided me at the counter or were the forms you claim to be "incomplete" required to be filled in during an intake interview?

As for the matter of confidentiality, I believe but not certain that whatever I have disclosed in anticipation of and or in actually therapy is done so with an expectation of privacy. Issues of confidentiality and ethical standards are addressed in the APA, and I assert I do have an expectation of privacy with regards to professional / client relations.

Please be specific in your response as to the forms you claim were not completed and note when forms were provided to me. You may either respond via email or US Post.

I do thank you for clarifying in the letter to Ms. Thomas the reasons for my not being "accepted into your program." I think you have accurately explained what you described to me by phone on November 21, 2003.

Dear Gentlemen: (Mr. Bartholomew, Mr. Browne, and Mr. Muenster),

This is a follow up on the letter from Dr. Bartholomew. His statement that "I rejected [them]" is blatantly false, and under the APA guidelines such a statement requires correction.

The truth be known, during my conversation with Mr. Bartholomew on the evening of November 21, 2003, Mr. Bartholomew stated the "order is psychotic" and when I asked what he means by "psychotic" his response was "psychotic is a distortion of reality, which that order is..."

Mr. Bartholomew phoned me back approximately a week later (on or about December 2, 2003) asking me if "[am I] ready to join the 'big boys' and agree to a minimum of 18 months?"

I stated that "I am, as you say a *big boy*, and my SOC is for 12 months and not a day more!" I went on to state that if he refuses me based on the length of my SOC, then he should put that in writing. So that I can present that fact to the court.

Mr. Bartholomew I do believe you have sufficiently addressed in writing what has been your issue with my 12 month SOC. However, Mr. Bartholomew you make a blatant misrepresentation when you state "[I] have rejected [you]."

Mr. Bartholomew, I request that you clarify for purpose of clinical and legal accuracy to be what I rejected was a term of time beyond 12 months.

Furthermore, I made it clear with witness present during both the November 21 conversation and the December 2 conversation, that I would be willing to join your program, but I will not agree to a term of more than 12 months.

I expect a written correction to this misrepresentation immediately as to your statement that "[I] rejected [you]." What is more, in the second paragraph to Ms. Thomas, you elude to the truth wherein you explain the time restraints put upon a state certified DV program and how you would not accept me outside of a minimum of 18 months.

If I do not have a retraction and correction both with me and my probation officer within the next four business days, (Friday, January 23, 2004) I will file a complaint for violation of ethical standards with the American Psychological Association (APA), and all other relevant governing bodies that you are registered with.

Misstatements like that which you have made in the most recent letter to my probation officer are slanderous, and any damage or injury I suffer as a result of that "distorted view of the truth and reality" will be pursued most vigorously.

I do not now and never have asked you to write what I wish to be written, but I have asked and renew my request that what you do write be complete, accurate, and truthful. Moreover, because you are a member of the APA licensed with the Washington State Department of Health I have an unqualified expectation that you would not write anything that is incomplete, inaccurate, and untruthful.

Furthermore, I expect this letter to be kept in confidence as a protected communication under attorney / client and therapist / client privilege.

Gentlemen, thank you all for your time, and please add this message to your respective files, and be advised that I will be in touch regarding Mr. Bartholomew's response.

I need to clarify that the reason I took your call was to ask you to stop contacting me or my office. We have no business to conduct. We never had any business. You have all the information from this office that you need. There is no need for any contact, now or in the future, under any circumstances, unless you are notifying me that you have corrected your SOC and would like to be reconsidered for application to this program. Otherwise any further contact will be considered harassment. Don't call. Don't email me. Don't write. Don't use my name in public. Period.

The incorrect part of your application was the handwritten amendments to the contract which you wrote in and which are totally unacceptable. Thus I don't have an acceptable application from you. You knew this before you raised the issue. Don't raise the issue again.

You are not a client of mine. You have never been a client of mine. You never entered the program. I have no counselor-client relationship with you. No money ever passed hands, no sessions were ever held. To the best of my knowledge I have never actually even seen you. Consequently I have no obligations to you as a counselor nor do the rules of a counselor/client relationship apply to this situation. I have, however, respected your privacy by not disclosing any information without your consent. You knew this before you raised the issue. Stop raising the issue. Period.

You have never been rejected by this program. You simply failed to provide me with the proper legal conditions and an unadulterated contract to be started. Don't tell anyone you were rejected: you rejected the program, not the other way around. You have known this all along. Representing it any other way is a lie. Don't do it. Period.

My business with you was concluded a long time ago. There is no reason for further contact unless you wish to reapply with a correctly written SOC. Any other contact will be considered harassment.

I have forwarded the recent communications to the appropriate regulatory agency of Washington requesting that they look into and assist in seeing that you adhere to accurate and truthful representations with respects to my contacts with you.

Also, I have copies of the paper work provided me at the time I was in your office. I have the original appointment card and records of my first three scheduled appointments.

Furthermore, on November 22, 2003, I wrote the court informing Judge Yeatts of yours and my conversation the evening of November 21, 2003. Any statement that I "rejected your program." is blatantly false. During our conversation the evening of November 21, you derailed my intake stating that without an 18 month or greater SOC you would not take me. You have repeated that in several variously manners throughout your communications.

You are now on notice to cease in any further contact with me and or communications regarding me. Any disclosure or release of information that you receive in regards to me are herein revoked. Any future communication you wish to convey to me or about me must be sent to my legal counsel, John Henry Browne. Including any corrected misrepresentations that you have made about yours and my interactions so that such may then be filed with the court.
